



-A discussion took place on continuing membership in the Beaver County Regional Council of Governments. Council agreed to continue this membership and appointed Mr. Robert Skocich as the delegate with Mr. Jim Skocich and Mr. Albert Sobolosky as the alternates.

-Mayor Rose requested that a \$1,500 donation from Norfolk Southern Railroad to the police department be transferred from the General Fund, where it was placed, into the police Drug Enforcement Fund. The Secretary stated that she spoke with the Solicitor regarding this and that she confirmed that it could be done. The donation was just made to the police department with no specific use for it so they can use it however they deem fit.

A motion was made by R. Skocich seconded by DeDominicis and carried to transfer \$1,500 from the General Fund to the Drug Enforcement Fund.

A motion was made by R. Skocich seconded by Krall and carried to grant the following raises effective January 1, 2015:

- Borough Secretary - 3%
- Asst. Borough Secretary - 3%
- PT Laborers - All to be at \$9.50 per hour

The Secretary stated that Council received a request to advertise in the Freedom Area High School Drama Department's play program. She noted that Council has done this the past couple of years but that they have done so with their own money. She said that the office would put together the ad and collect money from Council if they would like to do this again. Council said that they would do this again and would get the Secretary money.

Mr. R. Skocich said that there is a Flagger Training course on January 28<sup>th</sup> from 12:30-2:30 in Brighton Township. The cost of this is \$40 per person. All Public Works Department Employees are required to have this training now. He suggested that Council approve sending all five Public Works employees to this.

A motion was made by R. Skocich seconded by DeDominicis and carried to send all five Public Works employees to the Flagger Training Course on January 28<sup>th</sup> in Brighton Township and pay the \$200 registration fee for such.

President Sobolosky asked the Secretary what was going on with the Baden Sewage Agreement. She said that she has received some email correspondence between the Engineer and the Baden Municipal Authority engineer but nothing else. He asked her to forward those emails to him for his review.

A motion was made by R. Skocich seconded by Krall and carried to adjourn at 7:41 pm.
